## **Prees Walks**

## CIRCULAR WALK – A CIRCUIT OF PREES VILLAGE



## A clockwise 5 mile circuit with excellent views

## **Route notes**

- 1. Leave Prees Cricket and Recreation Club car park, turn right onto Cricket Meadow and then immediately left on to Brades Road.
  - a. Take first left into Harvern Gardens. Near the top of this cul-de-sac, take a pathway on the right between two houses.
  - b. After 20 yards take a left onto another pathway which becomes Pheasant Close and then go right at the end.
  - c. Turn left at the bottom of Whitebrook Meadow onto Station Road.
- 2. After 400 yards turn right at the fingerpost up a farm entrance at Ferny Leas Farm
  - a. Walk 50 yards up the farm drive and then;
  - b. Follow the right of way signs around to the right and then straight ahead through a farm gate onto a farm track.
  - c. There are often electric fences in this area which are sometimes hard to see. Take care to use the insulated clip handles to unfasten and fasten again once through.
  - d. The route goes straight on through 2 kissing gates and past a house called Lily Hall.
  - e. Continue down the driveway until you reach Lighteach Road. Turn left and walk along the lane for half a mile until you pass "Lighteach" a large white farmhouse.
- 3. 20 yards past the Lighteach farm turn right through a kissing gate into a meadow.
  - a. Continue through 2 metal footpath gates. Keep the two large pools on your right.
  - b. Having passed the pools keep walking along the right-hand field edge.
  - c. Go through another metal footpath gate into an arable field. Bear right and walk across the field aiming for a tall waymark post in the hedge.
  - d. Walk along that hedge heading towards Platt Farm.
- 4. As you arrive at the edge of the farm buildings please take particular care to follow the Right of Way route through the farm.

- a. As you leave the arable field, there is the end of a barn straight in front of you.
- b. Walk along the left-hand edge of that barn.
- c. Then walk along the right-hand edge of the round top black Dutch barn.
- d. Bear just slightly left to walk past the farm buildings in front of you.
- e. Walk through a metal farm gate into a small concrete stock yard.
- f. There's a metal footpath gate at the other side of the stockyard. Walk through it and bear slightly to the right across the field. Go through a kissing gate and join the Platt Farm drive.
- 5. Turn left on the Platt Farm drive and walk to the end where it meets the A49
  - a. BE CAREFUL of fast-moving traffic.
  - b. Turn right and walk on the right-hand verge for 100 yards.
  - c. Cross the A49 and continue on the left-hand verge until you reach kissing gate on the left which you walk through and across the field.
  - d. Go through the kissing gate on the far side of the field and take the path that **bears right**.

NB. An **alternative route** avoiding fields which sometime have cattle in them; Instead of taking the path to the right, take the path straight up the hill, crossing a stile and through a metal footpath gate, until you reach Moreton Street. Then turn right on the road and left after 100 yards into Primrose Lane. Re-join main route at step 8.)

- e. As you climb the right-hand path at step e above, look to your right and on a clear day you will see the Berwyn mountains on the horizon. These near 3000 ft mountains are about 35 miles away in Wales.
- 6. Once at Moreton Street turn right.
  - a. Walk along Moreton Street towards the church
  - b. Just before you come to some old brick barns on the right, turn left up a track. There's an old redundant water tower on your left. Stay close to the right-hand hedge and along a narrow snicket to a footpath gate which you go through
- 7. Cross 3 fields sticking to the right-hand field boundary hedge.
  - a. Please be mindful that these fields often contain fairly lively cattle, particularly if you have a dog.
  - b. Cross 2 stiles on the route across the 3 fields. There are also a couple of electric fences protected by plastic pipe. Push these down towards the ground or lift them up to get through.
  - c. At a 3<sup>rd</sup> stile you cross into a pathway alongside a house and garden on your right.
  - d. At the end of that pathway cross a further stile and turn right onto Primrose Lane.

- 8. At the end of Primrose Lane turn right onto a road. This is Lacon Street.
  - a. After only a few yards and with Elmhurst Nursing Home on your left turn left into Armoury Lane.
  - b. After 80 yards (and well before the lane takes a sharp left bend) take the path to the right. Climb over a stile into a little paddock.
  - c. At the far-right corner of the paddock cross a stile.
  - d. Follow the left field boundary and cross a further stile. Look to the left and enjoy fine views of Cumberbatch Wood, Hawkstone Park and Hall.
- 9. Cross another 2 stiles and you come to a wooden gate. Go through that and walk straight across the lawn.
  - a. Go through another wooden gate at the other side of the lawn and then over a stile and a little bridge to emerge in some well planted, landscaped gardens.
  - b. Walk across the lawned path to the far side of the garden keeping the house distant on your left.
  - c. There's a gap in the hedge. Walk through that and you immediately join the tarmac drive for a neighbouring house.
- d. Turn right and walk to the end where you turn left onto a road (Lacon Street).
- 10. Walk carefully up Lacon Street mindful of traffic.
  - a. After 300 yards you will see the school directly ahead of you.
  - b. Take the track to the left as the road turns to the right in front of the school.
  - c. Once you pass the black and white Church Cottage take the grassy path to the right past the front door of Rose Cottage.
- 11. Walk 100 yards along a green sunken path (with a school playing field on the left and the school playground on the right) until the path turns to the right. As the path turns there is a stile in front of you.
  - a. Cross the stile and turn left.
  - b. Follow the left-hand field edge to a field gate.
  - c. Go through the field gate and strike out diagonally across the field towards the power cable pole in the middle of the field.
  - d. If it's a clear day you will enjoy fine views of the South Shropshire Hills from this vantage point. Stiperstones and the Long Mynd are dramatic features on the horizon.
  - e. Just before you reach the pole, bear left down a sunken hollow pathway to a kissing gate in the far hedge.
  - f. You'll see an old WWII Nissen hut in the old quarry on your left.
  - g. Through the kissing gate go carefully down steps to the A49.
  - h. Cross the A49 CAREFULLY and continue up steps and through a further kissing gate on the far side.
  - i. Ahead you should be able to see the distinctive dramatic profile of the Breidden Hills near Welshpool.
  - j. Follow the right-hand field edge down to another kissing gate and then on to Shrewsbury Street.

- k. Go right and then left after 30 yards down a track between a house called The Beeches and the industrial estate. Cross a stile into a field, although if the field gate is open you can just walk through.
- 12. Follow the right-hand field edge.
  - a. Cross a small stream and through a kissing gate
  - b. Continue to follow the right-hand field edge. The path has been enclosed by a fence as it runs along the edge of the second (lower) field.
  - c. Go through a kissing gate and bear right on a track over a stream
  - d. Cross a stile next to a farm gate on that track.
  - e. You will then reach a lane. This is Brades Road.
- 13. Turn right along Brades Road and walk for 300 yards.
  - a. You will see Prees Cricket and Recreation Club on the left.
  - b. You have reached the end of your walk.
  - c. Prees Cricket and Recreation Club is a very friendly place, with a well-stocked bar and welcomes non-members.
